LIFE adds three new sports to the University roster



As part of LIFE's commitment to continually improve our sports offerings and the quality of sports programming at the University level, Life University Athletics is officially adding three intercollegiate sports to its programming roster:

Women's Cross Country will start this fall. Scholarships will be offered to qualifying athletes. An announcement naming the team coach will be coming soon.

Women's Volleyball will also start this fall, and will also offer scholarships. Athletics is looking to hire a team coach, who should be

officially announced around April or May.

Men's Wrestling will start in the late fall, with the majority of the season taking place during the following winter 2013. The search for a coach should conclude with an announcement around or before June 2012.

Stay tuned for more opportunities to cheer your Running Eagles on to victory, and a stronger, more comprehensive sports program at LIFE - coming soon to a field near you!

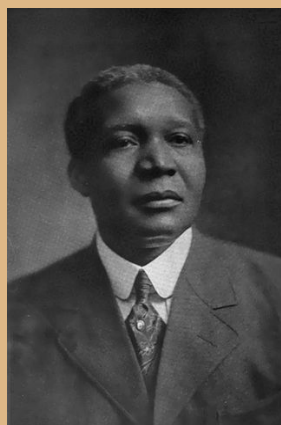
National Black History Month Profile: Dr. Robert Russa Moton

Dr. Robert Russa Moton was named president of the Tuskegee Institute following the death of Dr. Booker T. Washington, founder and first president, in 1915. Moton, as did his predecessor, dedicated his life to educating African Americans and shared Washington's philosophy towards industrial education as a means of advancement for the recently emancipated population. To the trustees of Tuskegee, Moton's ability to get along with both black and white southerners, and his potential to solicit funding support from northern philanthropists, made him the perfect candidate to further the work of Washington.

Moton was honored as one of the speakers for the dedication of the Lincoln Memorial in Washington, D.C., May 30, 1922, and his contributions to humankind earned him honorary degrees from Oberlin and Williams College, Virginia Union, Wilberforce, Lincoln, Harvard and Howard Universities. He was recipient of the Harmon Award in Race Relations (1930) and the Spingarn Medal (1932). Moton resigned from his college presidency in 1935, due to declining health. He died in 1940 and was buried at Hampton Institute.

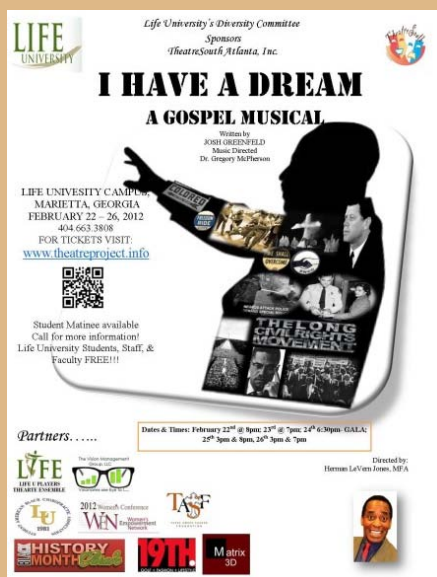
LIFE professor Dr. Michael Montgomery publishes new collection of poems

Larry Webster, D.C. Memorial Scholarship Now Available from ChiroFutures

ChiroFutures Malpractice Group has established an annual scholarship in collaboration with the International Chiropractic Pediatric Association (ICPA) in the amount of \$2,500 to be awarded to a chiropractic student enrolled at Life University.

The minimum criteria for eligibility is as follows:

- Applicants must have a cumulative G.P.A of 3.0 or higher
- Applicants must be ICPA members in good standing
- Applicants can be in 1st through 14th Quarter
- Applicants must provide a CV
- Applicants must submit a Project Proposal
- Applicants must engage in research and/or scholarship related to chiropractic and pregnancy, maternal or child health. The research or scholarship can be a new project proposed by the student as the principle investigator or an existing project that they are involved in as a co-investigator. They may also qualify if they are serving in other capacities on a project. The project can be any type of research study or scholarship related to the topics.

This is an annual award of \$2,500 with quarterly disbursements.

If a student applies but is not awarded a scholarship in one year, it does not preclude them from applying another year as long as they meet the criteria and submit a new application. In addition, scholarship winners may apply again in subsequent years if they meet the criteria. If an applicant receives other scholarships and/or financial aid, it does not affect their eligibility for the Webster Scholarship.

The Scholarship Review Committee, in its sole discretion, reserves the right to determine to whom a Scholarship will be awarded.

There is no fee to apply.

Applications and supporting documents must be sent in one envelope and postmarked no later than July 31st. Applications postmarked after that date will not be accepted. Applicants will be notified that their materials have been received (within 30 days following receipt). Winners will be notified upon final determination.

A program called "In Their Shoes" utilizes a hands-on, interactive format so you may catch a glimpse of what it's really like to have functional limitations that substantially alter a major life activity, such as learning, seeing, hearing or social function.

"In Their Shoes" is a mandatory training exercise for ALL Faculty & Staff at Life University. There will be a PRE/POST test with this training and a Certificate of Completion must be delivered to Student Success Center by no later than Monday, March 5, 2012 by 3 p.m.
