LIFE wins Division I basketball tournament, advances to NAIA Nationals



Life University's Running Eagles are the 2012 Association of Independent Institutions (A.I.I.) Division I men's basketball champions!

March 2-4, 2012, Life University hosted the A.I.I. Tournament on campus. The A.I.I. is an assemblage of six NAIA institutions that are not affiliated with any conference. Other participating teams were Morris College, Voorhees College and Allen University from South Carolina; Mountain State University from West Virginia; and Cal State San Marcos from California. LIFE played Cal State San Marcos in the championship game on Sunday, March 4, winning 90-65. The Running Eagles entered the tournament as the fourth seed and knocked off the No. 1 and No. 2 seeded teams to secure their bid to the NAIA National Tournament in Kansas City, MO., March 14-20.

In addition to our victory, hosting the tournament was great exposure for Life University - particularly when it came to showing off our athletic facilities, our beautiful campus and our Southern hospitality.

National Women's History Month Profile: Rachel Carson

Naturalist and wildlife preservationist Joy Adamson is best known for the books and films depicting her work in Africa, especially her inspirational book Born Free. Adamson spent almost forty years living on game reserves in Kenya, and became heavily involved in wildlife preservation activities.

Joy Adamson was born Friederike Victoria Gessner on January 20, 1910, in Troppau, Silesia, Austria, to a wealthy Austrian family. Joy married George Adamson, her third husband, a game warden fascinated by his encounters with animals. In 1956 he was forced to kill a lioness that attacked him while trying to protect her three cubs. Two of the cubs were sturdy enough to be sent to a zoo, but the Adamsons kept the third cub, a small female that they named Elsa. In her book, Born Free, Joy Adamson tells the story of how she and her husband raised the cub and then had to train it to fend for itself in the wilderness. Elsa's story in Born Free ended with the news that the lioness had three cubs of her own.

On January 3, 1980, the world heard the shocking news that Joy Adamson had been killed in the Shaba Game Reserve in northern Kenya, where she had been observing leopard behavior. Even more shocking was the original explanation for Adamson's death-that she had been attacked by a lion. Her body had been found on a road near her camp in Mawson, and it quickly became apparent to George Adamson and the authorities that human forces were responsible. Although authorities eventually convicted someone for the murder, the true story behind Joy Adamson's death remains a mystery.

ChiroFutures Malpractice Group has established an annual scholarship in collaboration with the International Chiropractic Pediatric Association (ICPA) in the amount of \$2,500 to be awarded to a chiropractic student enrolled at Life University.

The minimum criteria for eligibility is as follows:

- Applicants must have a cumulative G.P.A of 3.0 or higher
- Applicants must be ICPA members in good standing
- Applicants can be in 1st through 14th Quarter
- Applicants must provide a CV
 Applicants must submit a Project Proposal
- Applicants must engage in research and/or scholarship related to chiropractic and pregnancy, maternal or child health. The research or scholarship can be a new project proposed by the student as the principle investigator or an existing project that they are involved in as a co-investigator. They may also qualify if they are serving in other capacities on a project. The project can be any type of research study or scholarship related to the topics.

This is an annual award of \$2,500 with quarterly disbursements.

If a student applies but is not awarded a scholarship in one year, it does not preclude them from applying another year as long as they meet the criteria and submit a new application. In addition, scholarship winners may apply again in subsequent years if they meet the criteria. If an applicant receives other scholarships and/or financial aid, it does not affect their eligibility for the Webster Scholarship.

The Scholarship Review Committee, in its sole discretion, reserves the right to determine to whom a Scholarship will be awarded.

There is no fee to apply.

Applications and supporting documents must be sent in one envelope and postmarked no later than July 31st. Applications postmarked after that date will not be accepted. Applicants will be notified that their materials have been received (within 30 days following receipt). Winners will be notified upon final determination.
