LIFE Participates in the United Nations Summit on Non-communicable Diseases

In response to the growing global epidemic of lifestyle-related diseases, the United Nations convened a historic Non-communicable Diseases Summit Sept. 19-20 at the UN Headquarters in New York. Designed to rally global leaders to action to promote health, the Summit marked only the second time in its history that the UN has raised health issues to the highest level of global priority. The first UN Health Summit in 2001 addressed the rising global threat of HIV/AIDS. The new global threat, lifestyle-related disorders (heart disease, stroke, cancer, diabetes and tobacco-use disorders) account for 63 percent of deaths worldwide. This death toll is rising rapidly.

Because of Life University's innovative pioneering efforts in promoting local and global health, Dr. Ron Kirk, Professor of Health Promotion in the College of Chiropractic was invited to participate in this landmark gathering of global leaders. At the Summit, global leaders issued a UN declaration calling for the governments and the people of the world to take action to improve their lifestyles and the quality of their lives.
